Action Requested: Adoption of Retirement Memoir

Ameed Raof, M.D., Ph.D., assistant professor of medical education in the Medical School, retired from active faculty status on December 31, 2012.

Dr. Raof received his M.D. (1977) and M.Sc. (1980) degrees from the University of Baghdad, Iraq, and his Ph.D. (1984) degree and a diploma in medical education (1991) from the University of Dundee, Scotland, U.K. He joined the University of Michigan faculty as a lecturer in 1998, and was promoted to assistant professor in 2005. Dr. Raof was appointed director of the Division of Anatomical Sciences in 2010.

Dr. Raof was a gifted teacher and taught anatomy courses to a generation of medical, nursing, dentistry, and undergraduate students. He presented at 50 national and international meetings, and was a frequent and memorable presenter for the American Association of Clinical Anatomists and the International Association of Medical Science Educators. Dr. Raof received numerous awards in recognition of his teaching excellence including the Galens Medical Society's Elizabeth Crosby Award in 2001 and 2003, the Kaiser Permanente Award for Excellence in Preclinical Teaching in 2004, and the Senior Award from the Medical School's graduating Class of 2008.

The Regents now salute this distinguished anatomist and teacher for his dedicated service by naming **Ameed Raof assistant professor emeritus of medical education**.
