Action Requested: Adoption of Retirement Memoir

Nallapu N. Reddy, Ph.D., professor of economics in the College of Arts and Sciences at the University of Michigan-Flint, retired from active faculty status on December 31, 2004.

Professor Reddy received his B.S. degree from Michigan Technological University in 1961, his M.S. degree from the University of Missouri in 1963, his M.A. degree from the University of Notre Dame in 1964, and his Ph.D. from The Pennsylvania State University in 1967. From 1967-74, he was an assistant professor and associate professor at Clarkson University. He joined the University of Michigan-Flint faculty as an associate professor in 1974 and was promoted to professor in 1979.

Professor Reddy's major research interests include natural resources, energy, and environmental economics. He has published many articles in these areas and presented papers at regional, national, and international meetings. With a strong interest in international economics, he participated in the Salzburg Seminar in Austria and the Comparative Economic Delegation to Russia and the Ukraine, and he served as a visiting fellow at both Oxford University and the London School of Economics. Professor Reddy's expertise and reputation led to several media invitations, including two thirty-minute discussion programs on the ABC network.

During his tenure, Professor Reddy served the University with distinction. He was chair of the economics department from 1981-84 and from 1993-2000, and he participated on numerous committees including the Budget Priorities Committee, the Chancellor's Advisory Committee, and the UM-Flint Graduate Board. He was also instrumental in developing the honors program in economics.

The Regents now salute this distinguished economics educator for his dedicated service by naming Nallapu N. Reddy professor emeritus of economics.
