Dorit D. Adler, M.D., professor of radiology in the Medical School, will retire from active faculty status on May 31, 2009.

Dr. Adler received her B.A. degree from the University of California, Los Angeles in 1974, her M.P.H. degree from the University of Michigan in 1975, and her M.D. degree from McGill University in 1980. She returned to the University of Michigan in 1980 to pursue a residency and fellowship in the Department of Radiology. She joined the faculty as an instructor in 1984 and was promoted to assistant professor in 1985, associate professor in 1991, and professor in 2000.

Recognized as a national authority in the field of breast imaging, Dr. Adler is the author of over 70 publications in scientific journals and 7 published book chapters. She participated in a variety of funded research investigations, reviewed many scientific manuscripts, and was an invited lecturer at national meetings. She has served as a guest examiner in breast radiology for the American Board of Radiology, and in 1994 was named by *Working Woman Magazine* as one of the top 16 radiologists specializing in mammography.

The Regents now salute this distinguished faculty member for her dedicated service by naming **Dorit D. Adler professor emerita of radiology**.
