Subcontract Agreement between the University of Michigan

and Civionics, LLC

Action Requested:

Authorization to enter into Agreement

Preamble:

A statutory conflict of interest situation was identified by the Office of Research and Sponsored Projects while reviewing the Proposal Approval Form which then triggered a review by the UMOR Conflict of Interest Review Committee. A plan for management of the possible risks associated with the conflict of interest was then developed and approved by the Committee and agreed to by the parties involved.

This proposed agreement ("Agreement") falls under the State of Michigan Conflict of Interest Statute because Professor Jerome Lynch is an employee of the University of Michigan ("University"), and a partial owner of Civionics, LLC. The law permits such an Agreement provided it is disclosed to the Board of Regents ("Regents") of the University of Michigan and approved in advance by a 2/3 vote.

Background:

Dr. Jerome Lynch, an Associate Professor in the Department of Department of Civil & Environmental Engineering, College of Engineering, is the partial owner of a forprofit company called Civionics, LLC (the "Company"). The Company wishes to fund a Department of Homeland Security (prime) SBIR Phase I project entitled: "A Rapid-to-Deploy Agent-Based Wireless Sensing Architecture for Autonomous Structural Collapse Prediction" (ORSP# 14-PAF05779) in the Department of Civil & Environmental Engineering, under the direction of Dr. Jerome Lynch. The purpose of this project is to develop and test enhanced sensors for more accurate testing and evaluating of shoring (supporting) structures within buildings.

Agreement Terms:

The terms of the Agreement conform to University policy. The period of performance for the project is approximately twenty-four (24) months. The amount of funding support will not exceed \$15,986. Since research projects are often amended, this Agreement includes provisions for changes in time, amount, and scope of the project. University procedures for approval of these changes will be followed and additional conflict of interest review will be done as appropriate.

Impact of the Agreement

The Agreement will support an effort by Dr. Jerome Lynch to use his expertise and University laboratory, as well as other University resources to test and improve testing and evaluation techniques for structural integrity, and enhance human safety.

Recommendations:

This matter has been reviewed and approved by the UMOR Conflict of Interest Review Committee. In light of this disclosure and our finding that the Agreement was negotiated in conformance with standard University practices, I recommend that the Board of Regents approve the University's entering into this Agreement with Civionics, LLC.
