Proposed 2015-2016 University Health Service Fee

Action Requested: Approval of fee assessment of \$181.43 per student per term

Background: The University Health Service recommends a 2.7% increase in the Health Service fee for FY16. The fee will increase to \$181.43 per student per term.

The projected cost increases for UHS for FY16 are \$651,000, including a salary program, additional programming for alcohol risk management, medical assistants for compliance with new clinical requirements and a psychiatry physician assistant for psychiatric risk management. These cost increases will be met via additional student fees of \$414,000 and ongoing, aggressive costcontainment efforts that will generate \$237,000.

A summary of the Health Service budget is attached (Attachment 1).

Recommendation: We recommend that the Regents approve increasing the Health Service fee to \$181.43 for FY16. A history of Health Service Fee increases is attached (Attachment 2).
