### **The 2012 University Review of the Statement of Student Rights and Responsibilities**

Every University of Michigan student is expected to maintain the values enshrined in the Statement of Student Rights and Responsibilities. This year's review process of the Statement is a great opportunity for CSG to take a leadership role on behalf of students on campus to ensure that they are well informed and directly engage in the process.

The CSG appreciates the importance of this review process, and through the course of the summer and upcoming fall, we will continue to work with OSCR and the statement review board to ensure that the viewpoints and interests of students on campus are represented.

Once the review process is completed, CSG will continue working with OSCR to ensure the active dissemination of the updated Statement, and will be prepared to educate the students, regarding its significance.

### **2012 Biennial Review**

This year CSG is also participating in The 2012 Biennial Review Committee to ensure that the University of Michigan is in compliance with federal requirements for the University of Michigan Alcohol and Other Drug Policy for students, faculty and staff. This is a wonderful opportunity for CSG to continue its work in partnering with the University to ensure student health and safety relating to issues of alcohol and drug use.

CSG is appreciative to be a member of this Biennial Review and one of the major issues that we hope to address through this process is the inclusion of language to reflect recent developments with the passage of Medical Amnesty Legislation.

We have emphasized the importance of this legislation towards student safety and are working on provisions to ensure that the Amnesty is not intentionally misused.
