Richard Havard Moseley, M.D., professor of internal medicine in the Medical School, retired from active faculty status on May 16, 2014.

Dr. Moseley received his B.A. degree from Carleton College in 1974 and his M.D. degree from the University of New Mexico in 1979. He completed his residency in internal medicine at the New York Hospital, Cornell University Medical Center, New York in 1982 and his fellowship in gastroenterology at Yale University in 1985. Dr. Moseley joined the University of Michigan faculty as an instructor in 1985, and was promoted to assistant professor in 1987, associate professor in 1992, and professor in 2001. He has also served at the Ann Arbor Veteran's Administration Medical Center for a number of years and has held the position of chief of medical service since 1996.

Dr. Moseley is a leader in the fields of gastroenterology and hepatology, with special expertise in liver disease, primary biliary cirrhosis, primary sclerosing cholangitis, and drug-associated liver injury. His research focused on the mechanisms of bile formation and cholestasis, drug-associated liver injury, and nonalcoholic fatty liver disease. He was a frequent invited lecturer and published 64 peer-reviewed articles, 41 non-peer reviewed articles, 31 book chapters, and 53 abstracts. A gifted teacher and dedicated mentor, Dr. Moseley has provided extensive instruction to a generation of physicians. He has received numerous honors in recognition of his many achievements including the Department of Internal Medicine H. Marvin Pollard Award for Outstanding Resident Teaching (2001), the Richard D. Judge Award for Excellence in Medical Student Teaching (2005), the Department of Internal Medicine Chairman's Award for Outstanding Service to the Department (2007), and the Department of Veterans Affairs Under Secretary for Health's Hands and Heart Award (2012).

The Regents now salute this distinguished faculty member by naming Richard Havard Moseley professor emeritus of internal medicine.
