President Ono, Members of the Board of Regents, and Executive Officers of the University, it is our honor to submit the following report to you on behalf of the administration of University of Michigan-Dearborn's Student Government (SG). We look forward to updating you on our initiatives and sharing all that we have worked on.

Accomplishments:

We have successfully concluded the interviews for the Senate Chairs positions, with the selection process overseen by the Speaker and the Director of Inclusion. I am pleased to report that every Senator and Fellow within Student Government has been placed in committees aligned with their interests. This strategic placement will enhance their contributions and ensure their active engagement in addressing student concerns. In response to student feedback, we have purchased a microwave for the Renick University Center (RUC). This addition will provide students with a convenient space to heat up their meals, enhancing the overall campus experience and catering to their needs. We have met with the health professions advisor to discuss the possibility of offering MCAT mock courses. This initiative aligns with our commitment to providing students with accessible educational opportunities.

Projects:

In celebration of Pride Month, our Director of Inclusion has collaborated with the Pride organization to organize a tie-dye event. This event serves as a platform to bring students together, fostering inclusivity and supporting the LGBTQ+ community. By actively engaging students, we strive to create a campus environment that values and celebrates diversity. To enhance the student experience during exams, we are currently working closely with facilities on a project to introduce new attachable tables that are bigger than what we currently have. These tables will be larger than the existing ones in exam halls, providing students with increased space for writing and organizing their materials. We anticipate that this initiative will be completed by winter 2024. Additionally, we are actively addressing the management of Senate seats in relation to the proportions of students across various colleges. By properly managing the number of open Senate seats, we ensure that all colleges are adequately represented, and student voices are heard.

Student Government is committed to serving and representing the student body. We have achieved several notable accomplishments and have important projects in the works. We hope to continue our efforts to make the college community a better place for all students.
