Fall Student Organization Funding Opportunities

The Fall 2023 <u>Funding Application</u> is now open for all registered student organizations at U-M. There will be nine waves of content-neutral application review in line with CSG <u>funding</u> <u>policies</u>, with the first starting on 9/17. We are looking forward to supporting U-M's 1,500 registered student organizations through this initiative.

Diversifood

On the U-M Diag on October 8th, CSG will be hosting "Diversifood," a cultural food fair with opportunities for identity-based student organizations to table, perform, and share their culture's food and music. Our Programming team is currently in the process of reaching out to student organizations to get involved, and we look forward to this event to celebrate our community of Wolverines.

Engagement in Campus Planning and Strategic Visioning Efforts

CSG has been working closely with Campus Planning and Strategic Visioning Efforts to incorporate additional student engagement through an information session held for student org leaders as well as four focus groups centered around various topic areas.

Other Ongoing Initiatives

In addition, CSG has provided free GroupX passes to students, created a new Free Textbook Shelf at the Shapiro Library, and onboarded a cohort of freshman and transfer students for our first-year intern program. We have also recently hosted events such as Meet Your Representatives, Pride Outside, and a Maize and Blue Cupboard visibility event!

President Ono, Members of the Board of Regents, and Executive Officers of the University, it is our honor to submit the following report to you on behalf of the administration of University of Michigan-Dearborn's Student Government (SG). We look forward to updating you on our initiatives and sharing all that we have worked on.

Initiatives:

In collaboration with the Pre-Law Association, we are organizing an LSAT mock exam on September 29th. This initiative enhances students' preparedness for law careers by offering a simulated LSAT experience. To promote diverse medical research, we're collaborating with Precision Health for saliva sample collection on September 14th, 18th, and 25th. This aligns with our commitment to inclusivity in medical studies. Two Senate resolutions were passed: one establishes "Athlete of the Month" recognition, and the other forms a committee to build a boat for the yearly boat races hosted by our University. These initiatives strengthen campus culture and student engagement.

Ongoing Initiatives:

To address safety concerns, we're working with the Department of Public Safety and our Title IX coordinators to organize a campus safety event. This event will equip students with essential safety resources. As part of our commitment to civic education, we are preparing for Constitution Day. This event aims to engage our student body in discussions about the Constitution's significance, its historical context, and its relevance in contemporary society. A resource fair is in the works to connect students with various campus resources and support services. This initiative aligns with our goal of ensuring that all students are aware of and have access to the tools they need to succeed academically and personally. An MCAT mock exam is also being developed with the help of our Universities Pre Health Advisor.
